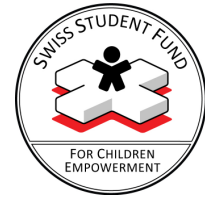

Funding: The relief projects are funded by donations and relief supplies. The associations's expenses are self-supported or covered by benefits of third parties

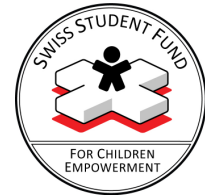
Purpose: Medical and preventive treatment of children in Latin America
Supporting the local medical care
Supporting the children by building up the infrastructure, e.g. setting up clinics in the children's villages, providing drugs, medical equipment, sanitary products, clothes and school equipment, so that healthy, educated young adults can move on from their life in the children's village to an independent working life
Promotion of the scientific exchange with Switzerland

Tasks : provide free prevention and dental/medical treatment of the children
Support the local dentists and doctors
Scientific exchange through speeches and contacts

Methods: a) in Cooperation with the local population
b) by organising volunteers on-site
c) on the basis of the local economic, social and political conditions
d) funded by donations and relief supplies
e) by guaranteeing information, transparency, liberty and codetermination

Why SSFCE: (1) The entire amount of each donation goes to the children; administrative and organisational costs are self-supported or sponsored.
(2) The costs of the projects are precisely drawn up: The prevention, examination and treatment of a child costs on average CHF 43 (around 42 US-Dollars/67 Euros). This includes medical instruments, material, drugs and immunizations. The actual work does not cost anything.
(3) SSFCE provides appropriate, verifiable support.
Children that have up to then not received dental care are sustainably enabled to lead a healthy life with a small financial contribution.

(4) To SSFCE, humanitarian work does not mean help or development. SSFCE's aim is in fact the empowerment of the local people, in this case an independent medical and dental care on-site carried out by the local dentists and doctors.

(5) SSFCE promotes sustainable projects through yearly check-ups and personal as well as scientific co-operation.
